In February, participants slept in their cars overnight, from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. to focus on the importance of a safe and secure place to live. Lloyd raised \$11,270 through his participation which is enough to help to provide stable housing for two homeless people for a year. Thanks to everyone who supported this important initiative. 
VIEW YOUR VISA BALANCE IN ONLINE BANKING

It's tax season! Our Members get a 20% discount on Turbo Tax online tax preparation services until May 1. Look for the promotion when you log in to online banking.




ANOTHER REASON TO GO PAPERLESS

ADD EXTRA LAYERS OF PROTECTION TO YOUR ONLINE ACCOUNTS

With fraud schemes and scams on the rise everywhere, it's important to remember FirstOntario offers several ways to help protect your accounts when you bank online.



Enable online banking alerts

Set it up so you are notified every time there is a change made to your personal access code, whenever there is a log in to your account, when a new recipient is added to receive an *Interac* e-Transfer[®] and when a new bill payee is added. By activating these four alerts, you're adding extra protection against unauthorized access to your accounts.



Create a strong online banking password

Have you updated your password yet? FirstOntario gives members the opportunity to create a secure personal access

code/password that is 12 to 30 characters in length with a combination of lower and upper case letters, numbers and special characters. The longer and more complex the password, the more protection it provides.



Bookmark FirstOntario's website

Add the FirstOntario or Creative Arts Financial website to your bookmarks/favourites so you know you are accessing our online banking services directly. Never click links in emails that redirect you to an online banking log in page and don't look for our log in page using a search engine. Download the FirstOntario app so you know you are dealing with us.
